So come join us as we learn how to "Keep the Paddle in the Water".



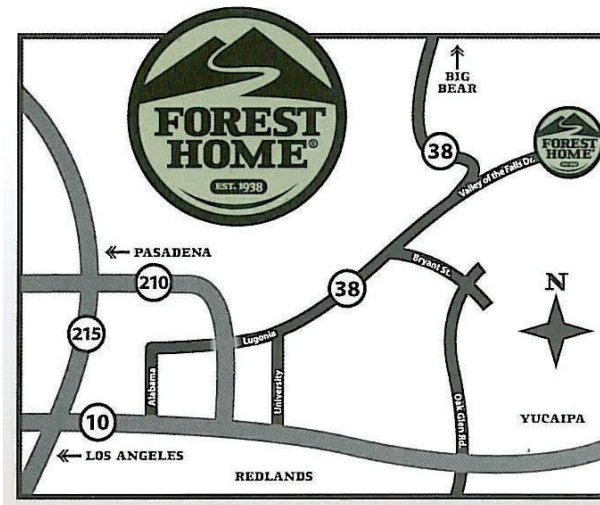
